## Galapagos Islands & Ecuadorian rainforest Day-by-day detailed itinerary (14 nights)

**SATURDAY: WELCOME TO QUITO**, colonial Capitol set in the Middle of the World and a UNESCO Cultural Patrimony of Mankind and World Heritage Site. Surrounded by snowcapped volcanoes, yet only 14 miles from the Equator line, the quaint capital of Ecuador boasts a spring-like climate all year round. Located in a huge valley in the Andes Mountains at an altitude of 9,455 feet, visitors can feel the crisp air while enjoying the city's rich colonial architecture, churches, monasteries and museums. Upon arrival, you are met at the airport for transport to Hotel Le Parc.

### **Hotel Le Parc \*\*\*\*\***

A new concept in hotels for Quito, the hip, upscale Le Parc opened in 2007 and is a symphony to cool, contemporary chic from its ground floor lobby bar and restaurant Blu with water moat and 5-foot horizontal gas fireplace – to the tip of its stunning rooftop terrace bar. Truly exclusive with 30 unique suites with king size beds (there is even a pillow menu), spacious bathroom with stand alone tub, L'Occitane amenities, Plasma TV, and Concierge services. The hotel has a compact gym, sauna and L'Occitane Spa with treatments and products. The hotel is within walking distance to the Parque Carolina with jogging trails and Botanical Gardens. Complimentary wireless internet, airport shuttle service is provided by SUV

**SUNDAY:** Buffet breakfast at Hotel Le Parc, Transfer to the Mariscal Sucre airport for your flight to Galapagos on Aerogal 36 departing QUITO at 8:55AM and arriving to San Cristobal at 11:20AM. Upon arrival to Puerto Baquerizo Moreno, **SAN CRISTOBAL** Island, our crew is waiting at the airport to escort you to your anchored yacht. After the welcome briefing, buffet lunch and safety drill, we set sail for **Playa Ochoa** where we have a wet landing. Here, we can test our snorkeling equipment and at the same time swim with a small colony of sea lions. Behind the beach, there is a tidal lagoon where bird can be spotted including the rare Chatham mockingbird. At sunset, we cruise around **Kicker Rock (Leon Dormido)**, a vertical tuff cone formation that abruptly juts up almost 500 feet out of the ocean. On the cliffs, we spot blue-footed boobies, masked boobies and magnificent frigate birds. This evening, the guides hold a briefing followed by the Captain's welcome party.

**MONDAY:** This morning, we visit the northeast tip of San Cristobal, **PUNTA PITT**, a tuff formation that serves as a nesting site for many sea birds including Blue footed, Nazca and Red-footed boobies, Frigate birds, Swallow-tailed gulls and Storm petrels. Punta Pitt is considered to be a first class site for birds and equal to Genovesa (Tower) Island. This afternoon we visit **CERRO BRUJO**, a breathtaking white power-sand beach, said to be one of the most spectacular in Galapagos and have an opportunity to snorkel or kayak right from the beach.

**TUESDAY:** This morning we have a dry landing at **Punta Suarez, ESPANOLA**, where we witness the highest rate of endemic species in Galapagos. Sea lions noisily greet us as we land on their beach. Curious Hood mockingbirds peck at our shoelaces. From April to

November, the waved albatross, found only on Espanola, perform their wild mating ritual. Colonies of blue-footed boobies engage in "sky-pointing" to show off for potential mates. Nazca boobies busily care for their young. Stunning swallow-tailed gulls are the only nocturnal gulls in the world. Red-billed tropicbirds take shelter under the cliffs. We also find Darwin's Finches, Galapagos Doves and Galapagos Hawks. Observe a unique specie of marine iguana identified with traces of red and green colorings. Colorful sally light-foot crabs crawl along the shoreline near to the famous "blow hole".

In the afternoon, we have a wet landing on **Gardner Bay, ESPANOLA (HOOD)**. Walk along seemingly endless stretches of this white sandy beach where you'll find large colonies of sea lions. There is no trail to follow so this is a chance to explore and you may find a Galapagos Hawk, Darwin's Finches or Hood Mockingbird. Swim with sea lions right from the beach, explore by kayak or just relax. There's an excellent snorkeling site off Gardner Islet with a colorful diversity of sea life near Tortuga Rock, explore caves covered with invertebrates.

**WEDNESDAY:** This morning we step ashore at **Punta Cormorant, FLOREANA (Charles)**, one of the few populated islands in the Galapagos. Floreana presents a rich history with mystery and intrigue. Set foot on a green-sand beach alive with the sounds of sea lions. Follow a trail to a brackish lagoon, home of the pintail ducks, common stilts, and the pinkest Flamingos in the world. Wind your way past a rich variety of plants including Morning Glory, Cut Leaf Daisies, Palo Verdes and Scalesia leading to a beach with power soft sand. Sea turtles lay their eggs in the sand dunes and rays swim in the shallow water. After the walk, we have an opportunity to snorkel at **Devil's Crown or Champion**, a shallow sunken crater colonized by a brilliant array of colorful fish and coral. This afternoon we visit **Post office Bay**, not the most scenic, but probably the most famous sites in Galapagos. Here is where a post barrel was put into use in the late 18<sup>th</sup> Century by English whaling vessels. You are invited to leave a post card and to pick up any mail from your home area.

**THURSDAY:** This morning we visit a hidden gem on Isabela Island called **Los Humedales and Muro de Lagrimas** which translates to "wetlands" and "wall of tears". This area has trails from which you find all four species of mangroves, secluded sandy beaches with rocky shores lava tunnels and natural pools. View migratory birds including Whimbrels, Short-billed Dowitchers, Wilson's Phalarope, Common Tern, Osprey, Semi-palmated Plovers as well as mating Flamingos. The national park has released young tortoises from the breeding center in this area so you may encounter tortoises in the wild. The Wall of Tears was constructed between 1946-1959 when Isabela was a penal colony. In the afternoon, we visit **Sierra Negra Volcano**, located in the Southwest portion of Isabela, and considered the oldest and largest volcano on Isabela. From Puerto Villamil, we travel by motorized vehicle to Santo Tomas. From here, we continue by horseback to the rim of the caldera, traversing a lava field through a series of craters and fumaroles until we reach Volcan Chico. Along the way, you will usually spot the vermilion flycatcher, Galapagos Martins, Whimbrels, Egrets, Galapagos Hawks and possibly the Dark-billed Cuckoo.

**FRIDAY:** This morning we visit Mosquera, a tiny islet between Baltra and North Seymour with a long narrow beach and large population of sea lions. After a wet landing, we will have time for swimming and snorkeling on this volcanically-formed islet. This afternoon we visit Bartolome, where it seems like we are walking on the moon. This young Island is inhospitable to most plants and animals. After a dry landing, climb 30 minutes up stairs leading to the summit of a once active volcano. Along the way, we pause to marvel at lava

bombs, spatter cones and cinder cones. From the top of the wooden stairs, we can gaze out across the island for a panoramic view of the island and "Pinnacle Rock", an eroded tuff cone. Crystal clear water is an invitation to snorkel from the beach or Zodiac with schools of tropical fish and Galapagos Penguins.

**SATURDAY:** This morning, we visit **SOUTH PLAZA**, a small geological uplift with tall cliffs offering spectacular views. After a dry landing, the trails lead us through Prickly Pear cactus or Opuntia and Sesuvium. Here we can find the Galapagos Land Iguana feeding on the cactus leaves. Toward the end of the hill, we encounter a colony of bachelor sea lions. The dominant bulls are in various stages of recovery from battles lost over prime beach territory. We also find Swallow tailed gulls, Shearwaters and Red-billed tropicbirds who build their nests along the cliffs. Travel by bus to the **highlands** of **SANTA CRUZ** Island. The scenery gradually changes as we wind our way through all seven vegetation zones found in Galapagos. Here, we visit the tortoise reserve at one of the private farms in the highlands where we encounter giant tortoises in their natural habitat. We visit *Los Gemelos*, Spanish for "The Twins", a pair of large pit craters where we find the bright red male vermilion flycatcher. We stop at "the tunnels", the largest lava tubes found in Galapagos.

**SUNDAY:** This morning, we drop anchor in Puerto Baquerizo Moreno, **SAN CRISTOBAL**. We visit the Interpretation Center opened in 1999. Here we gain a more complete understanding of the natural and human history of the Islands. Afterwards, we head straight to the airport for our flight back to the mainland departing San Cristobal at 12:30PM on Aerogal37 and arriving to Quito at 4:30PM. A snack is served on the flight. Upon arrival, transfer to Hotel Le Parc for overnight.

#### **MONDAY: QUITO TO SACHA LODGE**

Transfer to the airport for a 35 minute flight to Coca followed by a two hour motorized canoe trip down the Napo River followed by a 10 minute walk and dugout canoe ride brings you to Sacha Lodge, a private reserve built on 5000 acres. After a brief orientation, we choose our rubber boots and are shown our assigned cabin. Sacha is home to one of Ecuador's largest butterfly farm. Designed as a live exhibition conservatory, the Butterfly House is now successfully breeding nearly 40 species of local butterflies! Guests will be given explanation as to how these beautiful and unique insects are bred and raised, and later be free to wander through "the flying room", where hundreds of these colorful butterflies can be seen.

#### **SACHA LODGE**

Located along the Napo River in an area called La Providencia, SACHA lodge accepts 50 exclusive quests twice weekly. The lodge overlooks Pilchicocha lake which was hidden for millions of years, because of this, the flora and fauna has not changed since the beginning of time. The lodging at Sacha was carefully designed to offer comfort for the guests yet preserve the environment and rainforest ambience. Each of the 26 cabins comes fully equipped with two double beds with private bath and hot-water showers. All cabins are screened against insects and have high thatched roofs and modern amenities such as ceiling fans and electrical outlets. The cabins were constructed with traditional rainforest materials. In the rooms, guests may overlook the jungle from hammocks and often report seeing wild fauna such as Black-Mantle Tamarin's. Enjoy a raised lookout area above the gorgeous bar and lounge. Three excellent buffet meals are served daily.

## **TUESDAY – THURSDAY – SACHA LODGE**

Sacha's guests will be divided into groups of no more than six people. Each group will be led by a bilingual natural guides and a native Quichua guide with ancestral knowledge of the rainforest. Different tours through the jungle can be chosen by the visitor according to your interests. A typical day begins at sunrise, in order to take advantage of the cool morning hours when animals are most active. Afternoon excursions begin between 3-4 and often continue into the early evening. A night activity is offered every evening.

Constructed around an ancient Kapok Tree, the 135-foot observation tower (with an amazing 360 degree view) is definitely one of Sacha's highlights. Getting to the tower is half the fun. Take an exhilarating 30-minute dugout canoe ride through an eerie flooded forest with Capuchin and Squirrel monkeys jumping from branch to branch right over your head. The tower allows guests to get up close with the rainforest canopy.

The Canopy Bird Walk, is one of only a few rigid, self-standing, suspension canopy walkways in the world. Two of the three towers of observation decks every 40 feet making them accessible for everyone. The 900 foot long canopy walkway, suspended 120 feet above the forest floor, gives guests a birds eye view of all the wonders and beauty the tropical rainforest has to offer. The canopy walk is designed as a sturdy walkway enabling guests to move casually at their own pace.

## **FRIDAY: SACHA LODGETO QUITO**

We depart the lodge very early for our ride up river back to the town of Coca to connect with our ICARO flight back to Quito. Upon arrival, transfer to Hotel Le Parc.

This afternoon there is a choice of three activities:

1-City tour of Quito - discover the city of Quito on a three hour guided tour of Quito. Stroll down cobble stone streets and through flowering plazas while admiring the old colonial architecture of Independence square, including the House of Congress, the Presidential Palace and the Metropolitan Cathedral. Visit the church of La Compania, built in 1605, or the elegant cathedrals of San Francisco or San Augustin, Quito's oldest monastery.

2 -Mitad del Mundo (Equatorial monument) Placed precisely at latitude –0– , the monument known as Mitad del Mundo marks the spot where an 18th century French and Spanish geographic expedition located the position of the Equator. Proximity to this geographic feature gave Ecuador its name. Straddling the line puts one in both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres at the same time. Visit the Monument and Ethnographic Museum.

3- Teleferico – cable car ride to the top of the mountain from where you get beautiful views of the entire city of Quito

## **SATURDAY: QUITO - USA**

After breakfast at the hotel, our guide will meet you at your hotel to transfer you to the Masical Sucre Airport in Quito for your return flight home.
